TBTHeuro / 1BTHeuro / 2BTHeuro

These three classes study catering (Cooking, services, hospitality) in a three-year course. TBTHeuro is the final and exam year / 1BTHeuro is the middle year / 2BTHeuro is the first year when students start their three year course.

BTH means Baccaalaureat Technologique Hotellerie (restauration) ... adding euro to it, means that they are doing a complementary course in professional English (two or three hours a week) ..

Not all BTH classes follow the euro section ... only half of the class.

Our school periods

Our School year starts on early September and finishes on late June and some classes are involved in their exam on June.

During the school year we work on a frame of 7 week-school periods followed by 2 week-holiday periods but as students do 4 week-work placements, periods when students are not at school can be quite long (work placements + holidays.)
